It seems a far cry back to the year 1928 when the British Ring of the International Brotherhood of Magicians had a modest but enthusiastic beginning, yet from a little acorn has grown a mighty oak, and in this year of 1952, the British Ring can look back on a proud record in the magical field, a record rich in achievement every foot of the way.

has grown steadily, it's organisation of conventions enhancing the effective usefulness of the Art of Magic, and strengthening the bond between hundreds of magicians through our aims and purposes.

Today, the British Ring, as a part of that wonderful organisation, the International Brotherhood of Magicians, is respected by everyone, and it owes a lot to it's colourful personalities. People like William G. Stickland who has been the Hon. Secretary and Treasurer since 1932 when the Ring had a membership of only sixty two. He has been an influential figure in the I.B.M. and his work and keen spirit has lifted the Ring on to a high plane. It was a deserving tribute to Mr. Stickland that he was honoured by being elected President in 1950, and, through the death of Harry Kaye, last year, he continues to act as Acting President.

Harry Kaye too played a big part in writing the history of the Ring, and when his untimely death came shortly after bis appointment as President at the Bournemouth convention in 1951, a gap was left in our ranks which it would be impossible to fill. There are other men and women who are too numerous to mention, and who have helped the Ring over a very happy and distinguished course.

The first Annual convention was organised by L. Bofeys in 1931 when the venue was Cheltenham. The next year we again went to Cheltenham, but in 1933 the convention was held at Northampton. Both in 1934 and 1935 there were conventions at Leamington Spa, then back to Northampton in 1936.

The convention in 1937 at Buxton had some significance for it was in this year that the first printed monthly "Budget" was issued under the Editorship of Levante. Subsequent Editorshave been Harry Kaye; Stanley Cable; Eric Wilson; Howard Denovan; George Blake, and at present Alan Kennaugh.

On through the years, and in 1938 the convention went to Malvern to be followed in 1939 with a Southport convention.

The war intervened, and from 1940 to 1945 no conventions were held, but several functions were organised in London. The membership which numbered then about 280 was closed, and on the opening again in 1946 the system of having Interrogation Officers was introduced. The result has been a steady increase in membership and now we have 850 magicians on the roll.

The first post-war convention was held at Hereford, and we subsequently went to Buxton (1947) which marked the election to President of Herbert J. Collings, a well known magical personality and keen worker for the I.B.M. John Ramsay another popular personality from Scotland was elected President in 1948 at Bournemouth. Southport was visited in 1949 when the twenty first anniversary of the foundation of the Ring was celebrated, and His Honour Judge Wethered was elected President. Over to Harrogate in 1950 and then to Beurnemouth in 1951.

A noteworthy cycle of British Ring organisation is it's Welfare Scheme and Benevolent Fund, and the value of their contribution to the Ring can hardly be computed in only a few words of tribute. Suffice it to say that they make a decided impact of service in our constitution The Benevolent Fund has been developed steadily over the years, so too, since it's formation has the Welfare Scheme, and we now have a team of Honorary Liaison Officers covering the whole of the country, and in Ireland, Scotland and Wales. Under Hon. Welfare Officer, Eddie Dexter, they are concerned in keeping in touch with all members of the Ring who may be incapacitated by sickness or accident, and in other useful forms of welfare work

Now we visit Hastings and take up another chapter in our history as John Gambling, that grand "young" man of magic takes the Presidential chair. It becomes obvious that with confidence gained and assured, there will, through the coming years, be plenty of room for expansion and scope for even fresher and additional original ideas. Side by side with our increased stature will go the interest and support of our parent, the International Brotherhood of Magicians.

1066 AND ALL THAT

William the Conqueror picked Hastings for his well-known combined operation, and liked it so much that he took possession of the whole country. He founded the Castle, perched up on the West Hill, and complete with dungeons hewn out of the solid rock.

From the Castle you can look down on the Old Town, an engagingly cosy-looking muddle of re! roofs and chimneys, down in the steep valley between East and West Hill. But it's narrow streets are crammed with history. Hastings was a leading member of the Cinque Ports Confederacy, which in the Middle Ages guarded England's most vulnerable coast. Among the famous people connected with Hastings were Titus Oates, the infamous 17th century informer, Queen Anne's Admiral, Sir Cloudesley Shovel; and David Garrick; Byron, the Duke of Wellington and Dante Gabriel Rosetti

The centre of entertainment at Hastings is the White Rock Pavilion, just opposite the Pier, where many of our magical events will be held, but there are many other places of interest and should you have a few days after the convention, Hastings can offer a permanent list of holiday attractions while its places of historical interest and beauty stretch out invitingly.

One of the best points about Hastings—and it's a town simply bristling with good points—is the wealth of ways in which you can enjoy yourself. Whatever you place at the top of the bill we think you wil' remember Hastings, not only for your magical connections, but for the town's commanding beauty.





private demonstration of "CLOSE-UP" MAGIC

In 1895 Guglielmo Marconi came to England with his "little Magic Box"— the box which was to quicken the tempo of life and change the habits of a whole world.

His heirs in the Company he founded—Marconi's Wireless Telegraph Company Ltd.—are proud to have been asked to supply the "magic" of television to televise for the first time a private demonstration of "close up" magic.

Marconi Image Orthicon cameras broadcast the first television programme from the air. They televised Calais—en fete—the first time that a television programme had crossed the sea and the first time that a television programme had been transmitted from one country to another. These cameras are used to televise the proceedings of the United Nations and it was a Marconi Image Orthicon camera which identified the tragically sunken submarine H.M.S. "Affray" just over a year ago.
