

Message of Welcome from the Mayor of Brighton (Alderman Walter G. Dudeney, J.P.)



You will see them all at Brighton. The stars who shine on the big shows, the odd groups of magicians who have made a speciality of one branch of magic, and are content to make their appeal for it's good in odd corners. They are no less distinctive for that, and do in fact add lustre to an already brightly organised programme. The people who have been working throughout the year to bring you this feast are there too, but you may not distinguish them. They are often content to preside happily over each event —to see that it is the success they planned it to be. People like Wm. G. 



The Ring was founded by OSWALD RAE in 1928, and he remained our President until 1947. Now he is an active member of the Committee and he must be indeed proud to see the climb up the ladder of the British Ring. Here, names who come to mind as founder members are Joe Rendell; Prof. Bofeys; Walter Kemp; Nelson Denys—C. H. Turner and C. Ducrael. Mons. Ducarel passed away in 1939, and Nelson Denys gave up magic to enter the Church.

How JOHN GAMBLING would have loved to be present in Brighton. This wonderful old man, our past president, passed away during the year, but his presence was always felt at conventions, and despite his illness, he always took a keen interest in every event, even those held past midnight. HARRY KAYE too, who died in office as president, would marvel and delight at the growth of the organisation. Their pioneering spirit lives on.

I spoke of the "lesser lights" in Brighton. But often they are the ones who really matter. Those who come from all over the world to take part in the assembly. They are no lesser lights for not being officially chronicled in the organising list, and are often seen as stewards, or in some other capacity, filling the breach at the last minute.






