Southport Sorcery

Whilst a perusal of the history of Ring 25 (The British Ring) of the International Brotherhood of Magicians, reveals the fact that Cheltenham, Nerthampton, Buxton and Bournemouth have each accommodated two of the Annual Conventions, it is Southport, the 1955 venue, which has pride of place by catering for our magical needs, a third time.

We know that by the co-operation we have so readily received from His Worshipful the Mayor and his Civic helpers that we are assured once again of an hospitable welcome and that the stage is all set for a happy and most successful Convention.

The old stager looking back at the earlier Conventions will be well aware of the change that has come about during the post war stage of the British Ring's growth. He can hark back to the first Southport Convention when the membership was less than three hundred. At the same time he will recall with nostalgia many of the things he saw. In his mind's eye he will see again that great stalwart of the I.B.M. OSSIE RAE performing P. T. Selbit's version of the 'Sawing Through' at the Gala Show, which as it will be this year, was presented at Southport's Floral Hall. Another memory will be that of the Shield winning act of PAUL DUCAINE (Sid. Smith) in which smooth card and coin manipulation went to the making of a delightful silent sophisticated act.

To-day with a membership of more than eight hundred the overall size and attractions have grown so that one unused to these things and making his first appearance as a conventioneer finds a mammoth non-stop programme in which good friendship is allied to the best interests of magic. For this end this year's Convention Committee have laboured with the thought in mind that this Convention shall go one better than is predecessors. Though the programme which follows this little preface details the many events, let us see if we can summarise them and at the same time make a point or two regarding their content.

Commencing on the afternoon of Wednesday the 14th September, so much will be crowded into the space of a few hours. An outside publicity stunt by that famous T.V. magician, DAVID BERGLAS is soon followed by the official opening of the Convention by this year's President, GEOFFREY ROBINSON. With this important ceremony over, an entertainment most appropriate to the occasion will be given. Entitled 'Magic of the North', OSCAR PAULSON, Past President and great Ring stalwart has arranged and will present a cavalcade of magic in which Northern members will take part

The same evening will see a novelty "Café International". This it is hoped will serve the dual purpose of providing Ringers with a most novel entertaining evening in a continental setting and allowing every chance for getting together and reminiscing. Those who were present at the Christmas Party last year will find this a similar type of entertainment but on a more elaborate scale.

After the business meeting on Thursday morning, a great novelty is in store, for through the good offices of great American Conventioneer, MYSTIC CRAIG, there will be a showing of one of U. F. (Gen) GRANT's magical educational films. In this film, Grant will show some delightfully new tricks of his own and then explain how they are performed. As a necessary supplement a book!et containing full details of the lecture and the methods employed will be available at a most reasonable cost.

After Lunch we shall see a demonstration by our friends the Dealers. This we always feel is one of the high spots of any Convention, and its value to the rural member is priceless, for it allows him a chance of seeing a great deal of new magic, details of which, in the normal way he would only be able to visualise through advertisements.

Thursday evening we shall be entertained in the Floral Hall by His Worshipful the Mayor at a Civic Reception. After the formal presentation of members, there will be dancing, cabaret and the good company of one's fellow magicians. Then comes the Dawn.

Friday the day of the Shield Competition will see all of us watching the competitors, who under the aegis of Oscar Paulson have been banded together, and drawn for place of appearance. Each according to his ability and inventiveness will do his best to achieve the honour of winning the first award and thus earn a place in the Gala show of the following year. All our thoughts will go out towards them willing them to give of their best on this nerve shattering occasion.

Friday evening. The Convention Banquet, which this year sees an innovation for after the conclusion of the meal and its formalities the diners will proceed to another hall for the after banquet show which has been devised by WILFRED TYLER and takes the form of a series of Magic Round the World. This presentation will be given on the stage in the Cambridge Hall, adjacent to the Headquarters Hotel where adequate seating will ensure comfort and easy viewing.

Saturday brings the Children's show and the Gala show, the latter as on the occasion of the previous convention having a matinee and an evening performance. The hard work that goes into the production of an international bill is undertaken by the Secretary BILL STICKLAND, and only his knowledge and friendship with magicians throughout the world makes the building of a truly international bill possible. With us this year are SUZY WANDAS from Belgium who is one of the greatest magical show-women in the world; PAUL ARLAND, whose magical act with live fish is something that lives in one's memory; RENE SEPTEMBRE and his charming partner, a great French artiste who specialises in first rate magic with livestock; ALBERT LE BAS and partner from Ireland and Australia's own magicienne ESME LEVANTE. Our National contribution will include T.V's own magic man, DAVID BERGLAS; HARRY CORBETT with his famous T.V.

puppet, 'SOOTY': THE FABULOUS JUNE, another T.V. favourite who will act as commere; PERCY PRESS; RAM DAS & KIM and DERRICK SPEIGHT, the winner of the British Ring Shield in 1954.

Many say that the success of a British Ring Convention hinges on the standard set in the Gala show. With the list of artistes we have mentioned we feel that the hall-mark of success has already been affixed.

Midnight on Saturday will see the NEW ERA COMPANY's 1955 demonstrations. Those on their first visit to a British Ring Convention will in these performances find something that has no counterpart elsewhere.

On both Saturday and Sunday lecture sessions will take place. There will be FRANCIS HAXTON to talk on and demonstrate card

magic whilst LEWIS GANSON will treat his listeners to a talk and demonstration covering a wide field of practical items free from conventional apparatus. PERCY PRESS will rush from the Gala show to give a talk and demonstration interesting to magician and layman alike. Entitled 'Those were the Days', Percy will vividly recall some earlier experiences of his life as a itinerant magician.

At mid-day on Sunday the installation of the new President, EDDIE DEXTER will come as a fitting climax, especially as Eddie is a resident of Southport. Then will come the handshakings, those 'Here's to the next time' and a vast army of magical workers will take their leave of Southport looking forward to the twentieth Convention in 1956.



Conditions Relating To Performance in the British Ring (International Brotherhood of Magicians) Annual Competitions

These competitions shall be open to all paid up members of Ring 25 THE BRITISH RING.

There shall be three main awards as follows:-

1. THE BRITISH RING SHIELD and Cash Prize £10.

This will be awarded for the presentation of the most entertaining magical act and is held for one year.

2. THE CONVENTIONEERS' TROPHY

For greatest originality shown either in effect, method or presentation and is held for one year.

3. THE CRAIG TROPHY

For the best performance by a lady magician and is held for one year.

In addition there are the

THEO SPEAKER CUP and Cash Prize £5 for runner up. To be held for one year.

THIRD PRIZE £3.

No bar is placed upon the number of awards that can be obtained by a successful competitor and thus a male winner of the British Ring Shield, could, having presented the most entertaining and at the same time most original act, qualify for two awards.

In the same manner a lady competitor equally successful would be entitled to all three awards.

The length of the act submitted by each competitor should not exceed ten minutes playing time, and to assist him or her, a warning light will be flashed at the end of nine minutes. Any competitor exceeding a time of ten and a half minutes will be automatically disqualified and such disqualification will be announced from the stage immediately before the appearance of the next competitor.

The judges would consist of five members of the Ring, the local entertainments manager and the editor of the local paper. This composition might have to be varied according to location. There would be an umpire, a senior official of the Ring, who would have complete powers to accept or reject the judges decisions. If he rejected them, he would be required to place his decision and reasons therefore before the Committee.

For additional guidance, the Instructions to Judges are appended.

ANNUAL COMPETITIONS

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE JUDGES

There are three competitions which require your judgment. The first is for the major award, the BRITISH RING SHIELD.

This will be won by the act, which in your opinion constitutes the most **entertaining** magical act.

In view of this the act should be considered from the point of view of **entertainment.** Imagine you are seeing it in a concert, or dinner or other show, either by itself or with a number of other acts of various types. Does it entertain you?

The following points may assist you in judging:

- A. Consider general entertainment first—that is important—then, if you have several acts which you consider equally entertaining give your attention to the following:—
- B. Consider the entrance and exit of the performer, the stage setting and condition of apparatus, his or her dress, deportment and elocution, the nature of the tricks performed and the reaction of the audience. If the act is a silent one note the effectiveness of the mime.
- C. You will take into account magical ability, but as you are viewing this from the layman's angle of entertainment with magic, your judgment must not be biassed by a display of advanced technical ability which would **only be apparent** to a magician.

The points made above may help you decide. YOU ARE NOT LOOKING FOR NEW TRICKS—and if a performer does old ones very well in an ENTERTAINING MANNER—he deserves your marks. Remember that a layman may not have seen that vast repertoire of tricks that you know so well. Naturally the same remarks apply to patter.

The SECOND AWARD is for ORIGINALITY, and is in the main, the concern of those members of the panel who are magicians.

The merits necessary for this award are:-

- 1. Newness of effect, so far as is known.
- 2. A novel presentation employing twists on standard effects.
- The entertainment value contained in such presentation or effects.
- 4. An adequacy of mystery.

The THIRD AWARD is that given to the best lady performer. This requires no further elucidation, the merits previously stated applying equally in this case.

So as to allow for any disparities in judgment which may arise you are asked to write down the names of what you consider to be the best four acts, adding, if these do not qualify in the first four places, the performers entitled to the second and third awards. Seal your paper in the envelope provided and hand it to the Umpire. PLEASE DO NOT DISCUSS YOUR DECISION WITH ANY OTHER MEMBER OF THE JUDGING PANEL until you have all handed over your envelopes.






