

- 1. THE NEW SILVER BRITISH RING SHIELD and Cash Prize £25.00.
- This will be awarded for the most entertaining magical act and is held for one year.
- 2. THE CONVENTIONEERS TROPHY

The greatest originality shown in effect, method or presentation and is held for one year.

3. THE CRAIG TROPHY

For the best performance by a lady magician and is held for one year.

THEO. SPEAKER CUP and Cash Prize of £15 00 for runner-up.

To be held for one year.

THIRD PRIZE £10.00 and SilverWand presented by ALASTAIR.

TOM HARRIS CUP (Comedy) (donated by Tom Harris) Together with cash Prize of £5.00 **DITTIA SHIELD** (Manipulation).

- These Competitions shall be open to all members of The British Ring providing (i) that they are fully paid up and accepted member or (ii) that application for membership shall have been received by the Secretary by the last day of May preceding the Competition.
 The Management Committee of the Society shall appoint five magical Judges, including at the discretion of the Committee prominent
- visiting Magicians, together with a Chairman, who is also a member of the Society, and they will be responsible for the adjudication of
- the various awards. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

 3. If any member of the panel of Judges has been responsible for the production, tuition or guidance by way of advice to any competitor or feels that his personal relationship with any competitor may embarrass him, he must inform the Hon. Secretary and stand down and
- allow for a replacement to be made.

 There is no bar upon the number of awards that a competitor can win; it is possible for a male entrant to win the British Ring Shield, the Conventioneers' Trophy, the Dittia Shield and the Tom Harris Cup, whilst a lady entrant could win the British Ring Shield, also the Conventioneers' Trophy, Tom Harris Cup, Dittia Shield and Craig Trophy.
- The length of a competitor's act should not exceed ten minutes. A yellow warning light and buzzer will indicate nine minutes and a red light ten minutes. At ten and a half minutes the competitor will automatically be disqualified and such disqualification will be announced from the stage before the appearance of the next act.
- Competitors who wish to be judged for manipulative skill, comedy or originality shall, when completing the necessary entry form,
- give notice of such intention and they will be marked accordingly.

 The Judges shall have power to withhold any award if, in their opinion, the act or acts do not reach the required standard.

 A previous British Ring Shield winner shall not be allowed to enter and present the same act. There is, however, no bar to the presentation of a different act.
- Any competitor who has taken part in the Competition for three successive years and failed to qualify for an award shall, unless the Committee of Management deem otherwise, have a waiting period of two years before entering again.

 The ballot for order of appearance shall take place publicly not less than 24 hours preceding the competition.
- The presentation of every act should be considered as family entertainment and should be in good taste. Closing date for entries shall be notified in 'The Budget'.
- Any matter not covered by the foregoing rules shall be decided by the Committee of Management whose decision shall be final.
- All trophy winners shall hold their award for a period of one year and such award must be returned to the Hon. Secretary in a presentable condition at least 2 days prior to the day scheduled for the competition.

The draw for the running order will be made immediately after the opening ceremony on Wednesday afternoon, September 12th.

The names of competitors will be found on the separate sheet supplied with this programme.

Close-Up Contest for the Zina Bennett Cup

This competition shall be open to all paid up members of Ring 25 (The British Ring) International Brotherhood of magicians. There shall be three awards as follows:

- 1. The Zina Bennett Trophy (to be held for 12 months), a replica which shall be awarded to the performer with the highest marks, and £15, cash award.
- 2. A cash award of £10, to be presented to the runner up.
- 3. A cash award of £5.

No restrictions on the effects or properties to be used, except that they be primarily intended for close up performance. The magical judges shall be the sole arbitrators on this point and be empowered to deduct marks as they consider appropriate to the particular instance.

The performance shall not be less than 6 minutes and not more than 9 minutes.

There shall be four magical and one lay judge. The magical judges will mark each contestant under three headings: (a) Technique and skill; (b) Strength of magical effect on an audience; (c) Originality in method and/or presentation.

The lay judge shall mark on entertainment only; i.e. how much he or she was entertained by the contetsant.

A minimum number of 5 contestants is required for this contest to take place.

The event organiser shall have the authority to invite other performers (non-entrants) to perform in this event, when necessary, to ensure the smooth running of the contest.

A warning will be given when 8 minutes have elapsed and should a performer exceed the maximum time of 9 minutes the judge shall not award any marks for that performance.


