

23rd – 25th May 2020 Nonvention

From the webmaster and chief organiser

On the 6th April 2020, I circulated council suggesting that due to the cancellation of our convention, we could perhaps host a virtual one on the website. All were agreed this seemed like an excellent idea and so I set to work trying to source content. I wanted to include a dealers hall, a competition area, a theatre area which would have timed events. Originally, I expected this to run for two days, but when the event was announced on Facebook it was for the three days of the late May bank holiday weekend – as it turned out, this was just as well as thanks to some amazingly generous members (and non members) we had enough content to fill those three days, whilst fulfilling my own design brief of ensuring that members could get on with their normal lives.

And so I set to work finding the necessary "plugins", gathering the content, uploading it to a streaming service, designing the pages, resetting lots of passwords and guiding people through the logon process – and 6 weeks later, we went live.

It wouldn't be a British Ring event without at least one hitch – and the first hitch was the entire website crashing – probably due to the work given to it by the timed plugin – so that had to be scrapped, and the "old fashioned" edit as you need to method had to be employed. Virgin Media also decided that 7pm Sunday would be ideal to have some coverage issues, so although most members could access the website, I couldn't and was therefore unable to do the edit to put the gala show live – thank heavens for the Facebook group – I was able to share the link to the first half so MOST people were able to watch it at the advertised time.

My thanks go to all those in the various events who gave their permission to be included – all are credited in the following pages.



Elliot Bibby




